Cyber Mentor Project

Thoughts

- The goal of the Cyber Mentor project is to introduce your students to a wider array of perspectives, resources, and ideas than they might otherwise receive.
- Our Cyber Mentors are *volunteers!* They receive nothing for their time and efforts. These parents, teachers, etc. have volunteered because they are excited to share their knowledge and experiences with soon-to-be-teachers.
- When deciding how to recognize your students' Cyber Mentor communications (e.g., grades, extra credit) remember the Mentors are volunteers. While they are committed individuals, life situations or technology glitches do occur. Students should not be penalized for non-communication on the Cyber Mentors part.
